

Macintosh Font Usage

To ensure font substitutions do not occur, **supply all fonts used in your document. Also supply a printed list of all fonts used in your file with your order form.** We do support the standard Macintosh laserwriter fonts in the Adobe font format. (See list below)

Supply both printer and screen (10 and 12 point size) font files for any PostScript font. Truetype fonts have one font file that must be supplied. PostScript fonts are generally more reliable than Truetype fonts. Truetype fonts do not have the extensive font metrics that a PostScript font does so the output of a Truetype font is not always as clean and crisp. Truetype fonts have one font file, generally found in your system folder in the fonts folder. Supply any Truetype font used in your file.

The following fonts are the standard laserwriter fonts. We support the Adobe version of these fonts. If you are using any other version of these fonts (Truetype, Bitstream, Image Club, etc.) you will need to send all font files and tell us to disable our versions of these fonts.

Font File Basics



This is an example of an Adobe printer font. Other vendors icons will look different.



This is an example of an Adobe screen font. Other vendors icons may look different.



This is a Truetype screen font. Note the triple A icon for Truetype as opposed to single A for Adobe.



This is a font suitcase. Multiple screen fonts are generally contained in font suitcases to organize font families and minimize clutter.
